SCHERER PARK RENOVATION **COMMUNITY CENTER REOPENS**



Community members celebrated the reopening of the Scherer Park Community Center on August 14.

The event included remarks by Mayor Rex Richardson, Eighth District Councilmember Al Austin II and the Departments of Parks, Recreation and Marine and Public Works, as well as a ceremonial ribbon cutting and public access to the renovated community center.

The Scherer Park Community Center Project included new energy efficient windows, doors, electrical, lighting, roof and HVAC improvements. The center also received MAYOR REX RICHARDSON AND EIGHTH DISTRICT COUNCILMEMBER AL AUSTIN II CELEBRATE THE NEWLY RENOVATED COMMUNITY CENTER AT SCHERER PARK

new paint, graphics and signage. The park restrooms received new stall partitions, interior and exterior lighting for enhanced safety, new louvers for improved air circulation, and a new drinking fountain. The renovations to both the center, park restrooms and parking lot included improved ADA accessibility.

The \$2,157,027 project was supported by Long Beach Measure A and California Assembly Bill 32. The funding was approved by the Long Beach City Council in 2022 and 2023.

ENGAGING YOUTH IN THE POWER OF SPORTS DODGER DREAMTEAM PROGRAM



The Dodger Dreamteam (DDT) program is a sports-based youth development program that uses the power of sport to provide critical resources and services. DDT

registration sold out this year with 1,378 participants. A total of 20 volunteer coaches and over 50 staff coached 112 teams. The Los Angeles Dodgers Foundation (LADF) awarded a grant in the amount of \$96,240 to offset field maintenance and umpire fees

in the amount of \$30,240. The remaining \$66,000 was allocated to fund 2 Dodgers Dreamteam Coordinators. The LADF also provided in-kind contributions of uniforms and equipment for each of the participants in the program.



Highlights of the program included coaches training events at Pan American Park and Bancroft Middle School in April where the LADF revealed the "Coaches Playbook – Living Jackie's Nine". The playbook was revealed by Los Angeles Dodgers Manager Dave Roberts who shared his experiences as a coach and reminded the volunteers and staff in attendance how they can make a positive impact

on the community and the lives of the youth in our programs.

Participants of middle and high school ages attended a College & Career Accelerator College Workshop at Dodger Stadium (July 1st) where attendees received free Dodger Dogs, a Dodger Hat and tickets to a 2024 Dodger Game.



On July 6 the Dodgers Training Academy visited Pan American Park to offer a free skills clinic to all participants where they learned from collegiate and former professional players. All players received Dodger Tickets to a 2024 Dodger Game.

All participants were invited to PlayerFest on July 27 where they attended a day of fun at Dodger Stadium which focused on providing activities for youth to raise awareness in education, health care, homelessness and social justice. Attendees and their families received free Dodger Dogs, tickets to a 2024 Dodger Game, a reusable LADF water bottle and were entered into raffle opportunities.

Ages 5-8 participated in coed tee ball and coach pitch, ages 9-15 in baseball and 9-18 in softball. We will have played 384 games at the conclusion of the season!

PRM INSTRUCTOR SPOTLIGHT

JUJITSU & KARATE TEACHER RUSSELL KELLEY



Russell Kelley teaches Youth Jujitsu, Adult Jujitsu and Adult Karate

at Stearns Champions Park. Kelley, a long time instructor with Long Beach Parks, Recreation & Marine, has over 38 years of teaching experience to share with his students. Kelley holds a Yondan (4th degree) black belt in Danzan Ryu Jujitsu and

Yondan (4th degree) black belt in Shorin Ryu Karate.

Kelley's first martial arts class at Parks, Recreation and Marine (PRM) started at the age of 14 when he signed up for jujitsu and karate. He began teaching and training in 1986 with Lakewood Budo Kai with a break during his military service in the U.S. Marine Corps. He returned to the area to resume his training and in 2011 received Shodan (first degree black belt).

Russell owns Lakewood Budo Kai and has been an instructor with Parks, Recreation & Marine for six years. PRM classes allow Kelley to offer classes to a broad range of students in the area with fees lower than a traditional dojo, making it an affordable option for families with more than one child interested in martial arts or those with a modest income. This allows those who may not have the financial resources to join a dojo to develop their skills in the martial arts.

"Students learn they can do more than what they think they can achieve and gain a positive attitude to improve themselves with marital arts. It allows students to prog-

ress and see what they can do and gives them the starting point to launch their lives. Students learn self-defense, respect, and discipline in jujitsu, how to defend themselves and others which promotes self esteem, confidence and the drive needed to be successful in today's world."



Students describe the class as a great workout for stability, balance and overall good health and enjoy the sense of camaraderie the class instills in them. Many students have made lifelong friendships through the class. Classes are offered on a monthly basis for beginner to advanced students. New students start the first Monday or Wednesday of each month. Kelley offers jujitsu for youth ages 6-12, Japanese jujitsu for adults and Karate for adults age 13 years old and up.
